Follow Up and Consequences

Inappropriate behaviour is addressed in a fair and consistent manner which respects individual rights, responsibilities, age, maturity and special needs. Consequences are intended to be restorative rather than punitive in nature. It is also addressed in a manner that is intended to teach the expected behaviour and support a high standard of performance. School will take all reasonable steps to prevent retaliation against a student who has made a complaint about breached behavior.

Inappropriate behaviour typically has the following consequences:

- * A discussion of what has taken place and a review of expectations
- * A time out to reflect on behaviour
- * An opportunity to fix the issue if applicable
- * An opportunity to practice the expected behaviour with guidance
- * A phone call home to inform parents
- * Possible loss of privileges
- * Meeting with parents and school staff
- * Possible suspension
- * Possible expulsion

Inappropriate behaviour can consist of, but is not limited to:

- -defiant behaviour
- -lack of respect for others, teasing
- -throwing objects (rocks, sticks, snowballs, etc.)
- -not following school rules

Forms of unacceptable conduct cited above are only some examples and not an all-inclusive list.

Safe and caring schools are *free from:*

- -bullying, cyber bullying, harassment and marginalization
- -threat and intimidation
- -violence in any form
- -verbal, physical or sexual abuse
- -discrimination in any form including race, colour, ancestry, place of origin gender, religion, marital/family status, physical or mental disability sexual orientation, gender identity and expression and age.

Or Misuse of:

Cyberspace/Cell Phones/Electronic Devices/ Computers – students are to be aware that they may be subject to discipline (or confiscation of personal property) for misuse of technology if it negatively impacts on the school environment
